SUMMER

I've always associated the summer with change. I have a Book of Common Prayer from my time in Belize, and would love to share this liturgy with you. I enjoy experiencing a different liturgy now and then because this helps me to pay attention to the words that we say. When you are so used to saying what you say every Sunday, sometimes it is very helpful to take a step back and reexamine the words, their beauty, and their meaning.

Another opportunity I'd like to offer to those in our congregation is the chance to lead an adult forum. This could be in the form of a bible study or a presentation or discussion on a topic that you have knowledge or interest in. As much as I love adult education. I would also like the chance to spend more time in fellowship with people after the service. For that reason, I will only be leading adult education every other Sunday. If you are interested in leading an adult forum, or if you have a topic that you would like to see discussed, please contact me.

For the month of July, we are once again holding our "Thanksgiving in July" for Share. During the entire month of July, St. Dunstan's is focusing its outreach efforts on supporting our local food pantry. When you go to the grocery store I encourage you to pick up a few extra things to donate to those who are in great need in our community. Bring your items by the church and place them in the Share basket in the vestibule. There are people who will gather the items and take them over to Share. In addition to actual items. Share also accepts food cards and financial donations. We have a supply of envelopes in the vestibule that are designated for Share. If you have a food card or check or cash, please place it in one of those Share envelopes and then into the offering plate. You can make checks out to St. Dunstan's but write "Share" in the memo line.

One lasting change that this summer brings is the new paint on the exterior of the church. The Vestry has worked long and hard to determine what company would do the work and what colors to use. I would like to thank them for their hard work and dedication in helping to protect and beautify our church.

South of the Border "Green Card" Chili By Kevin Place*

The trick to this chili verde is slow roasting the pork in the oven first, and then adding it to the mixture of tomatillos and green peppers. Add to or subtract from the spicy jalapenos and serranos according to your taste.

Ingredients

Roasted Pork:

- 1 4-5 pound Boston Butt (pork shoulder), bone in
- 2 tablespoons ground cumin
- 2 tablespoons ground coriander
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper

Green Chili Base:

- 1 large yellow onion, medium diced
 - 2 jalapeno peppers, finely diced
 - 2 serrano peppers, finely diced
- 4 cloves of garlic, minced
- 2 24 oz cans whole tomatillos
- 1 large bunch cilantro, stems left whole and leaves chopped
- 1 tablespoon cumin
- 1 tablespoon red pepper flakes
- 2 tablespoons liquid smoke
- 1-2 limes
- Salt and pepper, to taste

To prepare

Roasted Pork: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Mix together the cumin, coriander, salt, and pepper to form a dry rub. Slice the pork shoulder in half lengthwise to create two thinner roasts. Remove some of the external fat, leaving some to keep the pork juicy as it cooks. Pat both halves dry and then rub with the spice mixture.

Layer a cooling rack over a deep sheet pan. Place both pieces of pork on the rack and cover the whole thing very tightly with tin foil. Roast the pork in the oven for 3.5-4 hours, or until very tender.

<u>Green Chili Base</u>: While the pork is roasting, prepare the 'green' of this chili. In a large dutch oven or other heavy bottomed pot, sauté the onions in vegetable oil until just translucent. Add the garlic, jalapenos, and serranos, and cook on low for another five or so minutes.

Meanwhile, place the tomatillos in a blender, reserving the excess juices. Add the cilantro stems, reserving the leaves. Blend the mixture until smooth but not entirely homogeneous. Add the tomatillo mixture to the onions and peppers, and let simmer on low until the pork comes out of the oven.

Putting it together:

Once the pork is finished, let it cool until it can be handled comfortably and then cut into 2 inch cubes. Using two forks, shred the cubes into individual strands, removing whatever fat is left.

Add the shredded pork to the dutch oven along with the cumin, red pepper, liquid smoke, lime juice, salt, and pepper. Add as much reserved tomatillo juice as needed to thin out the mixture to a chili consistency. Simmer on low for a half an hour, or until ready to serve. Before serving, adjust seasoning to taste and sprinkle cilantro over the top. Enjoy!

Jr Warden's Report

Our turn-out for the Spring Cleanup was 50 people, including two new families. This was a lower turn out than last year; however, a lot was accomplished. The Vestry agreed to move forward with Faith Painters for the exterior painting. Linda will also get a bid for the interior painting. The lock on the Parish door does not work and needs to be replaced. Barbara has agreed to look for competing bids to replace the lock.

Assistant Rector

The Haiti discussion meeting did not have a big attendance from people outside of the Outreach Committee. There are still a lot of questions about why we should commit to Haiti. It would be helpful to have someone from the parish visit Haiti when the St. George's group goes in October. The EfM group hosted a "mini theological reflection" after a service. EfM has one month left before summer vacation and will start back up in September. The Summer Sunday School will be focused on Anglicanism around the world. There is a plan to have 2 or 3 services from another country's prayer book. Anna will alternate weekends between Adult Ed and Fellowship. Going forward, Friday will be her day off.

Rector's Report

St. Dunstan's is hosting the McLean High School Baccalaureate on June 10th. The Region 5 meeting will be Monday, May 14th at St. Dunstan's. This Sunday will be Stephen's last before leaving for sabbatical. He will return on September 8th. The church will be used on Monday in the filming of a diocesan video about the relationship between clergy and musicians.

Strategic Planning

Perry and Philip have started a trial with Ekklesia and are cur-

rently building a test website. They should be able to share a demo prior to the next Vestry meeting in June. It will likely be several months before we are able to transfer to the new site.

Shrinemont will be the weekend of September 21st. Stephen, Gray, and Hedy will be there. Conner will be the main speaker for Shrinemont. We are looking into whether we can switch to a color copier. The Parish Directory needs to be updated this year (by September), and needs accurate email addresses for everyone.
