ST DUNSTAN IN MCLEAN

Dunstan was truly an extraordinary man and has been hailed as one of the greatest saints of the Anglo-Saxon Church. He believed in a strict monastic life. He was a Monk, Abbot, Bishop, Archbishop and later canonized as a saint. Even as a child he was noted for his devotion to learning and his mastery of many kinds of craftsmanship. He was master silversmith and perhaps the legacy of St. Dunstan in McLean was his bell making. I doubt that 1100 years ago there were many people who had the skills to forge bells. He did and he made an art of it.

Some examples of bells at St. Dunstan, McLean, are what you are reading right now, "The Bellringer" and included in the Sunday service bulletin is "The



Peal". Our real bell sits high up on the front of the church. My favorite bell is actually two bells that are the light fixtures on the ceiling of the chapel. To be honest, I had never noticed them until Father Steve pointed them out to me. The "old timers" will remember that the main sanctuary had these bell light fixtures as the main source of lighting until they were removed and replaced by track lighting. Another prominent legacy of St. Dunstan in Mclean is the magnificent stained glass window in the main sanctuary. One of the main depictions on the window is the snake and the tongs. Legend has it that he was tempted by the devil in the form of a snake and Dunstan used his tongs to grab the head of the snake and repel it. Finally, there is a banner that is displayed at various times that has the snake and the tongs depiction as well as a bell.

So, the legacy of St. Dunstan in McLean is shown in many ways. Next time before the service starts and the bell peals, think not that the service will begin shortly but rather of this great man for which our church is named.







The April meeting of the vestry was held as a planning retreat on Saturday, April 14th. The meeting was held at St. John's Episcopal Church, McLean in their conference room.

Vinson Hall Parking Update:

St. Dunstan's has submitted a proposal to Vinson Hall to use 30 of our parking spaces for \$40 per space per month. Vinson Hall is hoping to work with Chesterbrook Plaza for all their needed parking but an agreement has yet to be reached and if more spaces are needed they will contact us.

Exterior Painting/Repair:

Linda Young presented several proposals she has received for the painting and repair of the exterior of the church. Bids ranged from \$15k-\$29k. The vestry voted to go with Faith Painters pending customer reference checks.

Fellowship:

Mike Verderame and Brain Russo, the co-leaders of Fellowship, raised concerns of items just being dumped in the kitchen and left for others to figure out what to do with the items. As part of the May 5th Parish Work Day, there will be a significant kitchen reorganization and clean-up.

Strategic Planning:

The vestry focused first on the area of Membership Retention and Growth. They walked through all the steps of how a person finds St. Dunstan's, visits St. Dunstan's, becomes baptized or confirmed and than becomes an active member in the life and mission of the church. We agreed the church needs to be intentional about this process and have established some short and long term objectives that will be communicated to the congregation. The vestry looked at objectives for Outreach and Mission "relational" and with "intergenerational" being key themes. The day closed with a discussion of revamping our website and choosing a vendor. The process will continue at the next vestry meeting.
